- **8)** Isn't it strange that we can get to a sale or sporting event twenty-four hours in advance (stay in line outside in inclement weather) but we can't make it to church services on time?

- **10)** Isn't it strange how we share jokes that we hear right away, but when we are sharing messages about God, we think about it twice before we share it with others?
