Notes: One of the most crippling emotions is fear. During the past several weeks we have been dealing with the fear of the Coronavirus pandemic. That fear has taken several forms, anxiety, depression, worry loneliness or hopelessness. Then once the country was set to re-open a man was murdered by a police officer leading to demonstrations which started peacefully but ended with looting, arson and murder. Racism gets the blame but in reality, the source of turmoil is Satan and the condition of the human soul without the guidance of God. We are witnessing a clash of worldviews. The secular worldview; Common, Acceptable and Normal is constantly changing and moving. Change occurs when society says a common behavior; racism is no longer acceptable. Some folks believe only by violence can change occur. The looting and rioting are fueled when sin is excused and attributed to years of oppression and people are emotionally manipulated. God's worldview is Good, Acceptable and Perfect. Good means we treat all men with respect and love treating them as we want to be treated. Acceptable means it's pleasing to God. Perfect means it follows an objective standard which can be found in the Bible. Romans 12:1-2 1 beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. ² And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.
