Sermon: Identification Who Am I May 14, 2017

Scripture: Ephesians 2:1-9

Notes: Identity is how we define who we are. According to the world we are identified by our family or our occupation or by some life dominating sinful behavior. For example folks may say I am a Chemist or a school teacher. Someone may say I am an alcoholic or a drug addict. Americas Keswick has an interesting idea concerning how we can understand our identity according to the scriptures. Life is a journey and God has a model we can observe which will help guide our journey.

- **I. Our identity is modeled after the** <u>Israelites.</u> **1** Corinthians **10:11** Now all these things happened unto them for ensamples: and they are written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the world are come. In the previous nine verses Paul gives the folks at Corinth a history lesson about how God dealt with Israel. How God dealt with Israel gives us insight on how he deals with us. It will help if we realize Egypt is a picture of the world. First the Israelites are in bondage in Egypt, travel through the wilderness and finally to the promise land. When the Israelites were in Egypt they were in bondage to a cruel task master. They were provided with many of the desires of the flesh and exposed to idolatry.
- 1. When we are <u>separated</u> from God our identity is the <u>natural man</u> who resides in <u>Egypt</u>. Ephesians (2:1-3) The lost man is in bondage to sin because he inherits Adam's sin nature and is serving an evil cruel task master who provides many idols to keep us from seeking God.
- **A.** The natural man is <u>spiritually dead</u>. And you hath he quickened, who were dead in trespasses and sins; Of course we are talking about spiritual death. The lost person cannot understand the spiritual truths of God because those truths are revealed to us by the Holy Spirit who only lives inside the believers. Paul gives you further insight about the condition of our minds in **Romans 8:6-8** For to be carnally minded is death; but to be spiritually minded is life and peace. Because the carnal mind is enmity against God: for it is not subject to the law of God, neither indeed can be. So then they that are in the flesh cannot please God.
- **B.** The master of the natural man is <u>Satan</u>. Wherein in time past ye walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that now worketh in the children of disobedience The lost person serves Satan. They may not know it but they are serving him. Paul says in **Colossians 1:13** Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of his dear Son salvation transfers our citizenship from the kingdom of darkness to the kingdom of Jesus. The ruler of the kingdom of darkness is Satan. He described as a thief and murderer who has a goal of destroying our lives.
- C. The natural man lives a <u>sinful lifestyle</u>. Among whom also we all had our conversation in times past in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind; and were by nature the children of wrath, even as others. The word conversation means lifestyle; this is where we lived. The flesh is the part of a believer that desires to fulfill the desires of my fallen nature. Remember once Adam partook of the tree of knowledge of good and evil man inherited a fallen nature. The unsaved person is controlled by the world, the flesh and the devil. The sinner lives to fulfill the desires of the flesh. 1 John 2:16 For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world. Self is in Egypt which is a picture of the world. We are driven fulfill those things we desire. Colossians 5:5-9 Mortify therefore your members which are upon the earth; fornication, uncleanness, inordinate affection, evil concupiscence, and covetousness, which is idolatry: For which things' sake the wrath of God cometh on the children of disobedience: In the which ye also walked some time, when ye lived in them. But

now ye also put off all these; anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy communication out of your mouth. Lie not one to another, seeing that ye have put off the old man with his deeds; Notice it says those who are lost are children of wrath. Apart from Christ man is under judgment. **John 3:18**; **9:39** He that believeth on him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God........And Jesus said, For judgment I am come into this world, that they which see not might see; and that they which see might be made blind. These verses tell us man is already under judgment because they will not accept the truth that God has provided salvation through one man only. That is the Lord Jesus Christ.
