I. The Spirit <u>comes</u> on the day of Pentecost Acts 2:1-4¹

1. Peter highlights partial fulfillment of Joel's prophecy. Acts 2:16-18; 21

2. The Spirit reveals the <u>power</u> of the cross and resurrection. Acts 2:32-36

3. Peter instructs them on how to be saved. (38-41) Romans 10:9–10⁹

4. The Holy Spirit brings the blessings of grace. Titus 3:4-7

II. God uses the <u>Spirit to mold</u> us into the image of who He created us to be. Genesis 1:26–27

1. There is a process to remold us. Romans 8:28–29 .2 Corinthians 3:18; 1 John 3:1–2

2. There is the glory of fruitfulness. John 15:8-9

Thought for the Day The Holy Spirit is God Himself living inside of every believer. At salvation we are washed and renewed by the Spirit. This process is supernatural and should produce a change in our thoughts, attitudes and action. Sometimes we see a dramatic deliverance from depression because we feel God's love. Sometimes we find hope for seemingly hopeless situations. Often others tell us they see something different about us and we recognize that change. One area is forgiveness when we once would have sought revenge. As great as these changes are for living Dr. Robertson Mcquilkin suggest an even greater blessing is coming. He writes: The final activity of the Spirit actually begins now. The ultimate goal is not power-packed ministry, as exciting as that is. Nor is it merely to make us godly in character. No, the holy life is a means toward the ultimate goal, for only as we are like him, God-compatible, can we respond the kind of loving intimacy He designed for us. Oneness with God-that's his ultimate purpose. 1 John 3:1–2¹ Behold, what manner of love the Father hath bestowed upon us, that we should be called the sons of God: therefore the world knoweth us not, because it knew him not.² Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is. Pentecost is the fulfillment of a promise made by Jesus to send the power of God to reveal, inspire and illuminate all who accept Jesus as Savior and one day empower us to fulfill God's ultimate purpose for our lives.
