**Thought for the day** The battle Paul was fighting was works vs. faith. He used Abraham as an example. The ultimate test for Abraham was the offering of his only son Isaac as a sacrifice. At first glance it would look Abraham was justified by the work of being willing to offer Isaac.

**Hebrews 11:17-19** <sup>17</sup> By faith Abraham, when he was tried, offered up Isaac: and he that had received the promises offered up his only begotten son, <sup>18</sup> Of whom it was said, That in Isaac shall thy seed be called: <sup>19</sup> Accounting that God *was* able to raise *him* up, even from the dead; from whence also he received him in a figure. It was believing God was able to raise Isaac from the dead because he trusted God to keep his word. God gives us many promises, come with your burdens and I'll give you rest. He tells to pray about everything and he says wait until he reveals his will to us. Faith is the victory that overcomes the world. We have a hard time relying on faith because it is evidence of things we can't see and we want visual proof of everything. If I can work for salvation then I have control. Grace is a gift the involves surrender to receive. God has given us grace through faith because he knows we would never measure up to his standards in our strength. When I accept that I no longer need to worry about being worthy of his love. Instead I should praise him for allowing me the privilege of standing in His grace because He loved me enough to die to save me and He is responsible to keep me saved.
